My experience as a UTA was quite unique. Unlike most of the other UTAs, I graded not a single homework assignment or project. Instead, my time was spent holding office hours, helping almost every student with the notoriously involved homework assignments. I also worked with Dr. Watkins to improve examples used in the course, and gave him my perspective on the class notes before they were presented to the students.
